



Q2 Do you live in unincorporated Clay County surrounding Kearney?



Q3 How would you rate our community as a place for people to live as they age?





Q5 Some people reside in places outside the City of Kearney for part of the year. Which of the following best describes how you reside in our community?



Q6 Thinking about your retirement years when you do not work, how likely is it that you will move to a different home within the City of Kearney or surrounding community?



Q7 Thinking about your retirement years when you do not work, how likely is it that you will move to a different home outside of the City of Kearney or surrounding community?



Q8 How important is it for you to remain in the City of Kearney or surrounding community as you age?



Q9 If you were to consider moving out of the City of Kearney or surrounding community during your retirement when you do not work, would the following factors impact your decision to move?













Q38 How do you receive calls at home?


